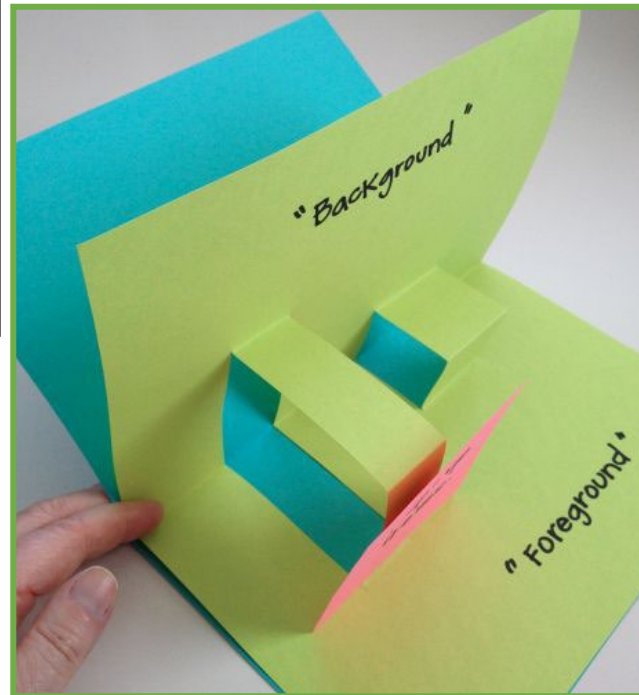


Knowledge Organiser – Pop-Up Book

Important Information

The first "pop-up" was more of a machine than book. It was invented by Ramon Llull who was a writer and mathematician. The device was composed of several revolving, affixed circles. The separate paper discs featured their own specific category such as: knowledge, verbs, and adjectives. The circles were cut out and fastened together so that they could rotate upon each other as needed. It wasn't for children, it was 500 years later before the first pop-up book for children was made. Moveable books were very popular in Germany and Great Britain.

Key Vocabulary

Functional	Designed to be practical and useful.
Appealing	Attractive or interesting.
Pop - up	(of a book or greetings card) containing folded cut-out pictures that rise up to form a three-dimensional scene or figure when the page is turned.
Mechanics	The machinery or working parts of something.
Mechanisms	A system of parts working together in a machine; a piece of machinery.
Prototypes	The first version of something you make
Affixed	To stick, attach, or fasten (something) to something else.
Component	A part of element of an object
Textile	A type of cloth or woven fabric
Rotate	Move or cause to move in a circle round an axis or centre.
